Is the Isle of Man Tempting You to Relocate

The Isle of Man's April 2026 census will provide an interesting update on the island's population and general demographics. This comes at a time when the small offshore territory is preparing for its annual influx of around 50,000 visitors to its flagship road racing event the TT motorbike races starting at the end of May 2026.

The Manx government seeks to grow the Isle of Man's population with a particular focus on the economically active. Some TT visitors eye the island as a relocation opportunity enticed perhaps by low crime levels, a quieter lifestyle and an attractive fiscal regime. Both government and private agencies assist those interested in relocation. For instance, Locate Isle of Man (www.locate.im) is a good place to start when contemplating whether island life might suit.

To those in the Common Travel Area of the United Kingdom and Ireland relocating to the Isle of Man can be logistically straightforward. Entrepreneurs wishing to transfer or establish their business here are targeted by the Manx government with various incentive schemes. The island's legal sector provides a professional back up to those setting up home or business here. The Isle of Man is a completely separate legal jurisdiction to England and Wales with its own laws and legal system. Manx lawyers are Advocates, combining the traditional roles of solicitor and barrister which remain separated in England and Wales. Manx Advocates advise on the full range of legal services from house buying

and estate planning to commercial litigation and company mergers. Legislation prevents non-Manx Advocates from conducting these reserved activities.

There are some key differences between the island's laws and those of the UK jurisdictions. This often manifests itself when cross border business between the Isle of Man and England runs into an issue and disputes arise. M&P Legal frequently deals with such enquiries. Initially we emphasise the need to ascertain the correct law and jurisdiction governing a cross border dispute and only then can the aggrieved party be satisfied they are getting appropriate advice in the right place. Creditors based in the UK should source local advice when attempting to enforce a debt claim against a Manx defaulter.

Another common crossover area relates to employment. The island's thriving finance sector hosts some large insurance, banking and e-gaming employers who have a network of offices in various jurisdictions. Adopting English law employment contracts for Manx based staff is inappropriate and leads to confusion and sometimes dispute. Having reliable local counsel will be a prudent step for those operating a business in the Isle of Man. Correctly drafted employment contracts and terms of business are preventative measures to minimise the chances of future jurisdictional or other disputes arising.

As the UK becomes an increasingly high tax jurisdiction, there will be those who see the
